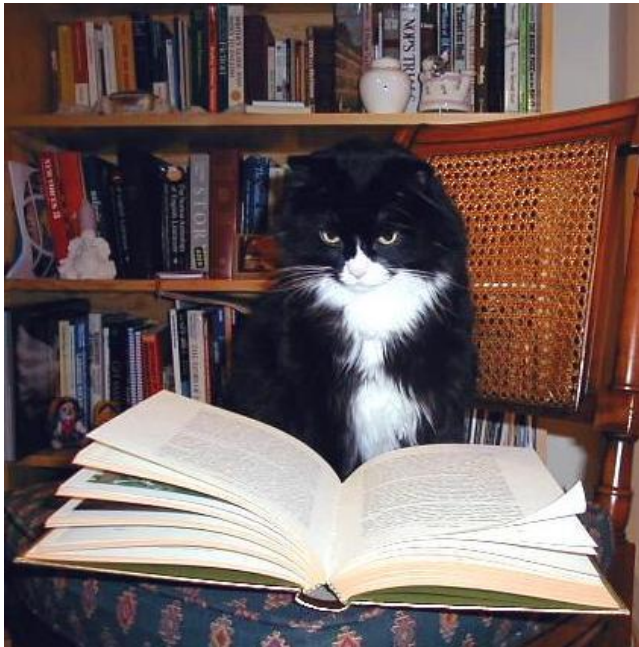


Reading Ideas for Juniors

On Your Own DEVICE

Did you know that you have access to all kinds of **FREE E-Resources** and all you need is your library card? Check out all that you can do by going to <http://www.banfflibrary.ab.ca/> and clicking on **E-RESOURCES**. You'll need your library bar code and pin number the first time you log in but can then change your information. Download a couple of apps and enjoy! Here's a few you might like to try:

FREEGAL – free music

HOOPLA – access to movies, TV programs and more

ZINIO – popular magazines & newspapers

MANGO LANGUAGES – learn one of 72 languages (Pirate!)

SOLARO – prepare for exams, including Provincial tests.

NOVELIST has reading recommendations for both fiction and nonfiction materials, for all ages. It offers recommendations for titles, authors, and series, based on what you like! You can also add your reactions to the books.

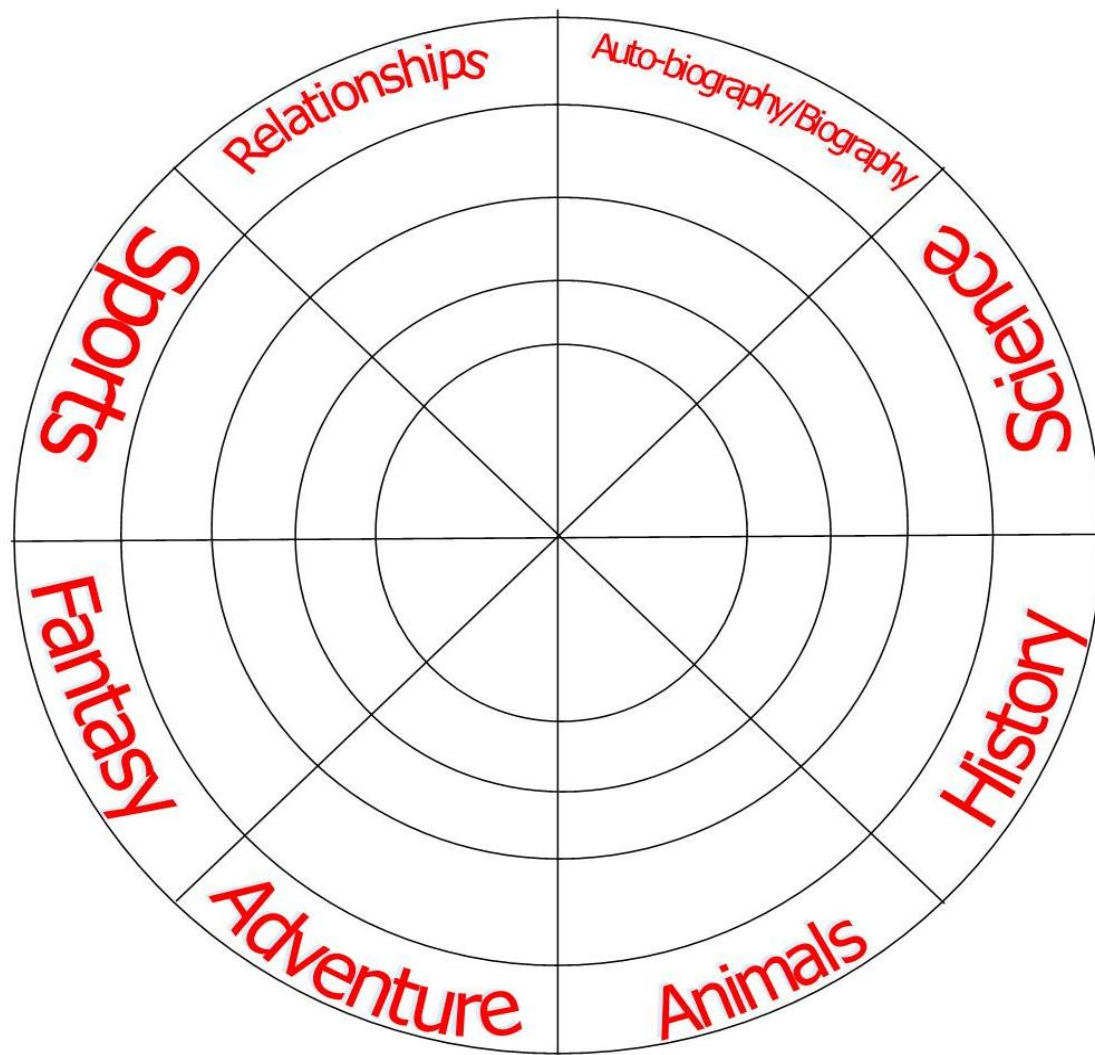

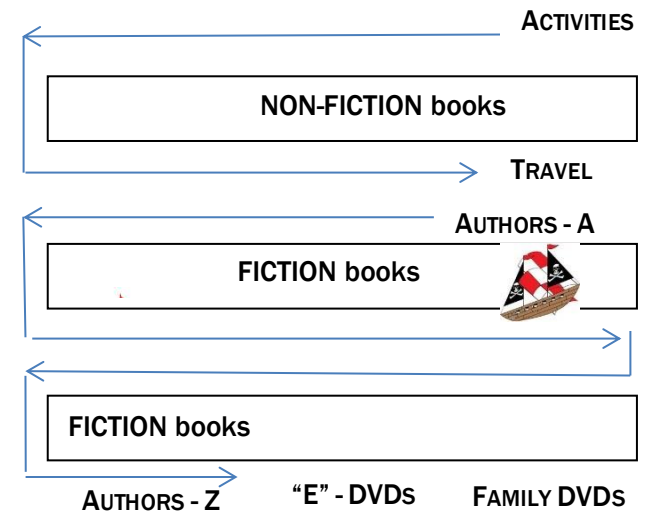

The Banff Public Library's section for juniors is intended for readers aged about 8-12 although children's reading skills, interests, and maturity levels may mean that they are reading from this area earlier or later. After all, this is where we shelve the Harry Potter books!

Try the "Five Finger Rule" to find out if a book is at the right level. Mum or Dad; Hold up five fingers, and ask your child to read a page of a book. Put down one finger for every word your child doesn't know. If you put down all five fingers, that book is too tricky for now.

Our non-fiction shelves are in the BISAC order which means they are in alphabetical order by subject and category. Looking for a book about learning Spanish? Look under "Foreign Languages - Spanish".
